Council reserves the right to cancel a course with less than 4 students 15 days before the course

Additional Fees are required to be paid to NRA to become a Certified Instructor / Range Safety Officer. Completion of these NRA courses does not certify you as an Instructor / Range Safety Officer until you have submitted your application along with the appropriate fees to the National Rifle Association and the NRA has reviewed the application and approved the application for certification. Once approved the NRA will issue certification credentials. Only once you receive your NRA credentials may you train / supervise others in the subjects for which you are certified.

Above course fees cover cost of certification of BSA, National Archery Association (NAA) and California courses. Credentials will be issued at the successful completion of these courses.

To be approved to use a BSA - Pacific Skyline Council range you must have on file at the council office a copy of your certification card(s) for RSO, Firearm Instructor (for that specific range), Cub BB Gun / Archery Range Officer.

In addition you may be asked at the council camp to show your certification.

Prerequisites for Course Attendance

Minimum 1 year shooting experience in the discipline being taken except BSA courses,
Pass a pre-qualification written and shooting exam- (NRA Instructor Courses)

APPLICANTS MUST ATTEND ALL SESSIONS OF THE SPECIFIC COURSE

Age 21 or older for NRA Courses - - 18 or older for NAA Archery Course & BSA Cub Range Officer Courses
Safety glasses and hearing protection to be supplied by the student for shooting classes.

Students provide their own lunch and snacks.

NO PRIVATE FIREARMS OR BOWS ARE ALLOWED AT ANY TRAINING COURSE WITHOUT THE EXPRESSED PERMISSION OF THE COURSE INSTRUCTOR.

Pacific Skyline Council Shooting Sports Program Course Descriptions

From time to time, the Pacific Skyline Council (PSC), through its Shooting Sports Committee, offer nationally accredited instructor training for Scouters and parents to allow Scouting units to participate in safe shooting sports activities, in compliance with BSA guidelines and PSC policy. Below are the courses offered, and what activities Scouting Units may participate in with such properly accredited instructor.

National Archery Association (NAA) Basic Archery Instructor Course: This course covers the basics of archery which includes Range Safety, How to shoot a bow, How to select equipment for beginner shooters, How to teach beginner shooters, How to run a basic program, sample lesson plans, how to teach simple drills and skills to new archers. This course is for those who are willing to teach a group of non shooters or basic shooters. Passing this course qualifies you to become a merit badge counselor upon NAA Certification.

Minimum 4 students and a maximum number of 24 students

National Rifle Association (NRA) Rifle Instructor Course: This course gives the students the skills, knowledge and attitude to become rifle instructor who can teach the basic rifle shooting program. Skills learned are how to teach, shooting positions, body positions, shot mechanics, sight picture, parts of a rifle, ammunition, winchester marksmanship program, shooting activities, practical exercises. cleaning and care of rifles, safe gun handling, shooting skills development. Passing this course qualifies you to become a rifle shooting merit badge counselor upon NRA Certification.

NRA/NMLRA Muzzle Loading Rifle Instructor Course: This course gives the students the skills, knowledge and attitude to become a muzzle loading rifle instructor who can teach the basic muzzle loading rifle shooting program. Skills learned are how to teach, shooting positions, body positions, shot mechanics, sight picture, parts of a rifle, ammunition, winchester marksmanship program, shooting activities, practical exercises, loading a muzzle loading rifle, safety aspects of muzzle loading rifle shooting. safe gun handling, cleaning and care of muzzle loading rifles, Shooting skills development. Passing this course qualifies you to become a muzzle loading rifle shooting merit badge counselor upon NRA Certification.

NRA Shotgun Instructor Course: This course gives the students the skills, knowledge and attitude to become shot gun instructor who can teach the basic shotgun shooting program. Skills learned are how to teach, shooting positions, body positions, shot mechanics, sight picture, parts of a shotgun, ammunition types and uses, winchester marksmanship program, shooting activities, practical exercises, safe gun handling, cleaning and care of a shotgun. shooting skills development. Passing this course qualifies you to become a shot gun shooting merit badge counselor upon NRA Certification.

NRA Pistol Instructor Course: This course gives the students the skills, knowledge and attitude to become pistol instructor who can teach the basic pistol shooting program. Skills learned are how to teach, shooting positions, body positions, shot mechanics, sight picture, parts of a pistol, ammunition types and uses, winchester marksmanship program, shooting activities, practical exercises, safe gun handling, hunting skills. cleaning and care of pistols, shooting skills development. No merit badge counselor abilities available.

Time: 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm Friday, 8:00 am to 7:00 PM Saturday and 9:00 am to 7:00 pm Sunday

Where: Friday & Saturday - Pacific Skyline Council Scout Office, 1150 Chess Blvd, Foster City, Ca.

Sunday - Range to be Determined

Minimum of 4 Students and a Maximum of 16 students

California Handgun Safety Certification: This short course is required in order to purchase a handgun. Student wishing to obtain this certification must pass a test. The materials for this course are available from the instructor.

Time: Upon Request or as part of the pistol course

Where: Upon Request or as part of the pistol course

NRA Range Safety Officer Course: This course is designed to give the students the basic knowledge, skills and attitude necessary to run a range safely. Skills learned include RSO roles and responsibility. Range standard operating procedures (SOP), range inspection, firearm stoppages and malfunctions, range briefings which include emergency procedures.

It does not cover shooting instruction.

This course is required for all groups who wish to use council camp ranges
(exception cub scouts and weblo's only need the BSA cub scout bb gun range officer certification).

Time: 9:00 am to 6:00 PM Saturday

Where: Saturday - Pacific Skyline Council Scout Office, 1150 Chess Blvd, Foster City, Ca.

Minimum of 4 Students and a Maximum of 24 students

BSA Cub Scout Archery Range Officer Course: This course give the basics of archery instruction, range operations, shooting skills so you can run an effective archery program for cub scouts and weblo's.

BSA Cub Scout BB Gun Range Officer Course: This course give the basics of BB Gun instruction, range operations, shooting skills so you can run an effective bb gun program for cub scouts and weblo's.

Time: 9:00 am to 5:30 pm - This is a combined one day Range Officer course

Minimum of 4 students and a Maximum of 16 students

Shooting Activities, Ranges and Personnel Needed

Pacific Skyline Council Camp Ranges

Archery

All Scouting Units, youth groups and adults- Cub Archery Range Master or NAA Archery Instructor + one additional adult 18 or over.

BB Guns

All Scouting Units - Cub Scout BB Gun Range Master + One adult 21 or over
Non Scout Youth Groups - Cub Scout BB Gun Range Master + one adult 21 or over.

Rifle and Muzzle Loading Rifle, Shotgun

Limited to youth 11 and older Boy Scout, Venturing, Exploring, Learning for Life
Applies to all groups youth or adult.

RSO and Instructor to be 21 or over

An NRA Range Safety Officer must be present at all shooting activities (not the same person as the instructor).

An NRA Rifle Instructor is required in order to teach 22 cal. Rifle skills and usage.

An NRA Muzzle Loading Rifle Instructor is required in order to teach 45 or 50 Cal. Muzzle loading rifle skills and usage.

An NRA Shotgun Instructor is required in order to teach 12 or 20 gage shotgun skills and usage.

Pistol

Limited to youth 14 and older Venturing, and Exploring
Applies to youth and adults.

RSO and Instructor to be 21 or over

An NRA Range Safety Officer must also be present at all shooting activities (not the same person as the instructor).

An NRA Pistol Instructor is required in order to teach any caliber pistol skills and usage.

NRA Range Safety Officer (RSO)

RSO to be 21 or over.

Required for all units shooting rifles, muzzle loading rifles and shotguns and Venture units shooting rifles, muzzle loading rifles, shotguns or pistols (exception cub scouts and weblo's only need the BSA cub scout bb gun range officer certification).

They are not authorized to instruct any shooter in the use of any firearm, and if instruction is to be given, it must be by an appropriately certified NRA Instructor (not the same person as the Range Safety Officer).

Private Property Ranges

Must follow BSA rules and regulations relating to personnel, range layout, approval from local law enforcement and planning Departments.

Private Club and Public Ranges

Must follow the rules of the club or public range. Note most clubs and public ranges will have their own personnel / staff to run the range and offer instruction. If they do not then the above requirements will be applied.

TOUR PERMITS

A Tour Permit is required for your group to go to one of these types of ranges as a unit activity. Contact your local scout office for the proper forms. Tour permits must be filed at least 1 week ahead of your event. Plan accordingly.
