45 Scouts participated in one-week intensive youth-led leadership training.

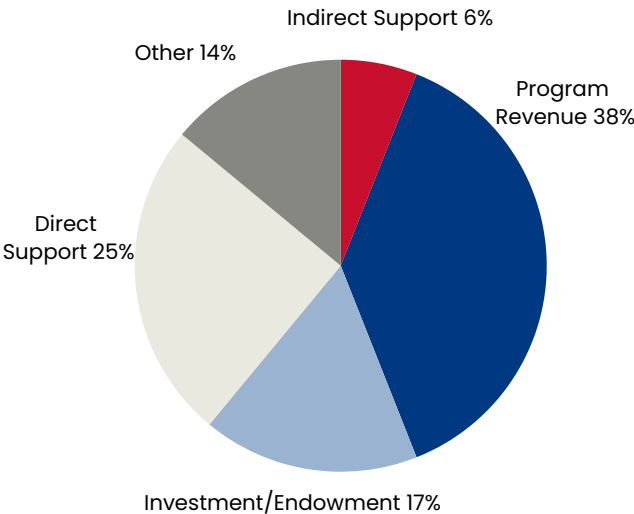
Order of the Arrow

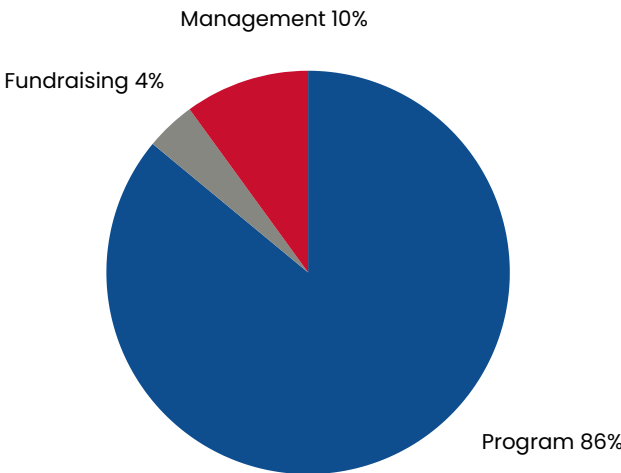
